
Program content is not changing.

Changing needs of families:

- Dual-earners
- Single-parent households
- Many underserved communities prefer to participate as families
- Less free time
- Input from volunteers was overwhelmingly positive
- Programs are relevant for boys and girls

As a result, we need to ensure our programs are accessible for today's families.





- Due to declining membership numbers nationally (we've been growing locally)
- A departure from the BSA's core mission and values
 Our mission is to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law
- A change in Cub Scouts or Scouts programming
- An attempt to undercut other youth programs
 We support the work of all youth serving organizations and want more kids involved in character-building
